About St. Rose School

St. Rose School was founded in 1956 by the Daughters of Charity, whose mission was to provide a Catholic education accessible to students of all backgrounds. The sisters remained with the school until it became self-sufficient, after which dedicated parents, parishioners, and staff continued their legacy. Over the years, enrollment has fluctuated, and there have been seasons when funding was so limited that closure seemed imminent. Yet, through faith, perseverance, and countless sacrifices, the community has kept St. Rose's doors open.

Today, St. Rose School serves students in one classroom per grade – kindergarten through sixth grade. Academic support is provided through a part-time Title I aide, who administers fall DIBELS assessments and leads the intensive intervention program. A new reading and science curriculum have both been adopted for implementation in the 2025–2026 school year. The school continues to align with Common Core Standards, introduced in 2011, and recently reintroduced the Six Traits of Writing (2024–2026), with ongoing professional development to support teachers in these areas.
